## <u>Destiny Perkins</u> Chapter Captain, Northern Nevada



I was struggling and going through some very challenging circumstances. I was apprehensive at first, but found an amazing community of people at the PB Abbate Warrior Weekend in Utah. I am not the kind of person to ask for help, but I was able to let down my guard there because I was surrounded by such like-minded people.


The weekend was a much-needed recharge for me. I was able to be vulnerable and heal. There was also more laughter than I've had in a long time. The scenery at Warrior Rizen Ranch was breathtaking, but it didn't hold a candle to the connections I made. I returned home and was able to push through the challenging situation I was in with a much better mindset. I also gained an amazing support network of friends that I still talk to today.

As I prepared to leave Utah, I wanted to bring the same experience I had to Northern Nevada. There is a large veteran population in this area. My time as a 911 dispatcher here showed me that there's so many veterans struggling or in crisis. There is an amazing group of veterans that are here who share my same vision. We hosted our inaugural event on Veterans's day and hosted a veterans archery day and barbecue. We are beginning fundraising for a Warrior Weekend in Northern Nevada and I hope it can help even one veteran as much as it helped me. Our goal is to have a retreat in October, and we plan to get together as a group as much as possible between now and then.





Patrol Base Abbate honors the generosity of our donors. We set a 5-year goal to reach 90% of every dollar donated being used to impact our members through our programming. At current rate, we are tracking the realization of this goal ahead of schedule.


In 2023, our donations significantly extended their impact, achieving a 59% increase in the number of veterans served, while incurring only a modest 4% rise in RTB programming costs. These funds enabled the organization to reach over 800 veterans across all in-person engagement opportunities, demonstrating the profound effect of donor support on our mission to bring veterans together in community.

Over the past year, Patrol Base Abbate has significantly focused our efforts to dramatically increase both membership and programming. We have achieved this growth due to the immeasurable contributions received from supporters, donors, and volunteers. It is our promise to those who have served that we continue to strive for greater ways to positively impact veteran mental health and resiliency.



### **Utah Warrior Weekend**

This year, Patrol Base Abbate executed another Regional Return to Base Program, or Warrior Weekend. Thanks to a very generous grant from our friends at the Kahlert Foundation, we opened an opportunity to all of our members in Utah and the surrounding areas to reconnect, recalibrate, and rediscover. Warrior Rizen Ranch hosted us on their amazing property in the Wasatch Mountains and we arrived just in time to be welcomed by crisp fall weather and a vast canvas of leaves turning colors across the mountainside.

Our members participated in yoga and meditation each morning to start the day, a service project to help the ranch and their many horses, and shared stories of challenge and triumph around the campfire each night. During the day, Warrior Rizen Ranch and the community of Morgan, Utah provided fly fishing on the ponds and rivers of the property, horseback trail rides through the mountains, archery lessons, and more miles of trails than could be hiked in a long weekend. Each activity was facilitated by a local professional who is now either a new member of Patrol Base Abbate or proud spokesperson, telling their loved one about us. Our service event was conducted on the ranch, adding many helping hands to an overdue project in the horse pens. We conducted our sandbag ceremony among our new friends as we honored our namesake, Sgt Matt Abbate, and found gratitude for the heroes in our own lives who urge us towards the best versions of ourselves.

This experience, as all our premier programming experiences, offered a trusted community, a shift in perspective, a brief period to quiet the noise and recalibrate our focus on the things that matter in our lives. Throughout the weekend, deep bonds were formed, struggles were shared, victories were celebrated, and everyone walked away with a renewed sense of self. With new friends, new focus, and batteries recharged, our Utah members emerged ready to better serve themselves, their families and the communities around Utah. The bonds formed at this event remain strong to this day. We cannot wait to expand this amazing program into more communities around the country where our members live, work, and play.

### Our Permanent Patrol Base for Those Who Served



In early 2023, Patrol Base Abbate acquired an amazing property that was tailor made to house our programs and our members. Our permanent Patrol Base consists of 60 acres that backs up to 250,000 acres of national forest land and sits in the mountains above the Clark River Valley, just outside of Thompson Falls. One main cabin with two large bunkhouses provide some climate controlled spaces to escape the weather when it is time to be inside. Our huge fire pit is home to our fireside chats where much of our healing and growth takes place. The property is completely off-grid, running on solar panels, a battery bank, and generator backups with two wells to supply water. Our access to wilderness and all forms of outdoor activities from our Permanent Patrol Base is endless.

We have plans to expand the opportunities on these 60 acres through both construction projects and programs in order to ensure this forever remains a place for those who served.

Montana was more than a four day trip. It was an exploration of self and a time to hear from others who served. From Vietnam to the GWOT everyone had a story to tell and lessons to share. This is a tribe. Everyone has a voice... I left as an improved version of myself and we left the PB [patrol base] better than we found it. There it is.

Dpbabbate does a lot of things right. They figured out the formula for fostering community. And their RTB program did just that for me. I met a lot of great folk whom I admire deeply.

Thank you @pbabbate for inviting me out for Fight Club to train and connect with veterans. The friendships and humor were unmatched and reminiscent of my days in the Marines. Learned a deeper meaning of humility, identity, tribe and service.

Many of us have faced similar challenges post-service and have found that reconnecting with your tribe and those who have walked the same line can be extremely beneficial. If you served in this nation in any of the branches uniform -@pbabbate has a cot and a sandbag for you to fill.



LeMay Family Goodworks supports, protects, and defends veterans, children, and families in an effort to promote overall mental and physical well-being in our communities near and afar






